- $\frac{\text{Table 10.}}{\text{a particular relationship between two or more clauses in a sentence.}}$ The three conjunctions listed are those which occurred with relatively high frequency and consistency in the text translations.
- Table 11. Major Locative Relators. A locative relator is a noun which occurs regularly in a locative expression which contains an actor complement. For example: sa luqob nang ba:hay 'inside the house'.
- Table 12. Major Temporal Relators. A temporal relator is a word which indicates a time relative to the time of the utterance. In Tagalog these words also enter into construction with other temporal morphemes indicating parts of the day. For example: kani:na-ng uma:ga 'this morning' (earlier today in the morning); bu:kas na ha:pon 'tomorrow afternoon.'
