

LATERAL-NASAL ALTERNATION IN AUSTRONESIAN
AUSTRONESIAN "NASAL CONGESTION"
THE CASE FOR LATERAL/NASAL ASSIMILATION OR DISSIMILATION
or LATERAL-NASAL ALTERNATION IN AUSTRONESIAN

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There are a number of reconstructions posited for Proto-Austronesian or some of its meso-languages which differ by one segment. These have traditionally been labelled "doublets". One such kind will be treated in this paper, namely those that differ by having PAN *l (or *L) and any member of the nasal series (particularly *m, *n, *ŋ, but also *ñ and *N).

The provenance and antiquity of this alternation will be under investigation. Can we establish a priority of one set over the other? Has the presence of two nasals in some forms led to dissimilation, or has a lateral assimilated to a nasal? What of the possibility that this kind of alternation has led to spurious reconstructions?
